

## **DETAILS OF SERVICES/ SCHEMES REACHED TO THE PUBLIC:**

### **1. MPLAD Scheme:**

As per provisions made in this scheme each MP is to suggest to the head of the district works to the tune of Rs. 5.00 crore per year to be taken up in his/her parliamentary constituency since 2011-12. Separate Cash Books are maintained for each M.P. The Collector, Dhenkanal is the nodal Collector for the MPLADS funds in respect of S. Tathagata Satpathy, Hon'ble MP, Lok Sabha, Dhenkanal.

### **LIST OF WORKS PROHIBITED UNDER MPLADS**

1.	Office and residential buildings to Central and State Governments, their Departments, Government Agencies/Organizations and Public Sector Undertakings. However, construction of Railway Halt Station, subject to provision of para 3.35 will be permissible.
2.	Office and residential buildings and other works belonging to private and commercial organizations.
3.	All works involving commercial establishments/units.
4.	All maintenance works of any type. However, re-boring of hand pumps, subject to provision of para 3.32 will be permissible.
5.	All renovation and repair works. (However, works of retrofitting of essential lifeline buildings, viz Govt. Hospitals, Govt. Schools and Public buildings to be used as shelters in an emergency and heritage and archaeological monuments and buildings with specific permissible available from the Archaeological Survey of India will be permitted under MPLADS).
6.	Grants and loans, contribution to any Central and State/UT Relief Funds.
7.	Naming of assets after any person.
8.	Project of movable items except as those provided in Annexure-IIA of MPLADS Guidelines.
9.	Acquisition of land or any compensation for land acquired.
10.	Reimbursement of any type of completed or partly completed works or items.
11.	Assets for individual/family benefits. (However, as per para 3.28 of the Guidelines, tricycle (Including motorized), artificial limbs and battery operated motorized wheelchair to differently abled deserving persons are permitted). MPs may also provide MPLADS funds to Centrally sponsored Schemes providing assets for individual/ family use, with the proviso that the MP will not add or charge the priority list or any of the criteria for selection declared in the centrally sponsored scheme. He may not nominate specific individual as beneficiaries, but can nominate the geographical area where these MPLADS funds would be spent.
12.	All revenue and recurring expenditure.
13.	Works within the places of religious worship and on land belonging to or owned by religious faith/group. (However, construction of crematoriums and structures on burial/cremation ground irrespective of religious faith can be taken up under the MPLADS regardless of the location being adjacent to or falling within the area under the places of religious worship).
15.	Construction of Swagat Dwars.
16.	Execution of works in unauthorized colonies.

## 2. MLALAD Scheme:

The Member of Legislative Assembly Local Area Development Funds (MLALADS) has been introduced in the state since 1997-98. It is intended to be utilized for small but essential works/projects as per felt needs of the local people. This fund is being utilized on the recommendations of Hon'ble MLAs.

14.	Water-Supply work in problem villages, Tube -wells, tanks, Sanitary Wells.	Individual assistance scheme/such as seeds, fertilizers, etc.
15.	Construction of Check Dam, Water Harvesting Structure, Small Minor Irrigation Project, Branch Canals and its improvements.	Survey, Evaluation and Research.

16.	Construction of Cattle Dispensary Building, L.I. Centre Building.	Purchase of fuel/machinery for repairs for vehicles.
17.	Community Prayer Halls, Public Library Buildings, Bhagabat Ghar repair/Restoration of old religious places/works.	Radio, Television to Community Centre.

**3. SPECIAL PROBLEM FUND:-**

The Special Problem Fund (SPF) is received in the form of Grant-in-aid for projects sanctioned by Govt. in P & C Deptt. Projects like roads, tanks, community centre, pilgrim rest shed, Electrification etc. are taken up out of this fund.

**4. SPECIAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FUND:-**

The Special Development Programme Fund (SDP) has been introduced in the state since 2012-13. It is intended to be utilized for small but essential works/projects as per felt needs of the local people. This fund is being utilized on the recommendations of Hon'ble MLAs. This funds is utilized as per the Guidelines of MLALADS.

### 5. CRITICAL GAP FUND:

The scheme of "Critical Gap Fund" has been introduced in the state since the year 2016-17. The scheme aims to address the basic rural and urban infrastructure needs as priority with special emphasis on zero connectivity area, health, drinking water etc.

The fund provision for the scheme is made through the state plan budget of the Planning & Convergence Department.

10.	Construction and extension of Government Ayurvedic/ Homeopathic Dispensaries.	Repayment of loan clearance of arrears and liabilities, purchase of land, payment of compensation.
11.	Provision of Drinking water in problem villages and urban local bodies.	Surveys, studies, evaluation and research projects.
12.	Development of infrastructure facilities at places of tourist importance.	Construction of office buildings, staff quarters of Government/ Non-Government organizations,
13.	Construction public Library buildings, community/public utility centres.	Works relating to commercial organizations/service associations.
14.	Projects for environmental/wild life protection.	Installation of statues/ construction of memorials and memorial buildings.
